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#### Guide of acceptable identification documents

Identification document type - Provide ONE of the following:

- 1. Australian Drivers Licence (must be current).
- 2. Australian Passport (either a current passport or a passport that expired within the last two years).
- 3. Government Proof of Age Card or Photo Card issued in Australia (must be current).
- a) Foreign Passport (must be current); ANDb) A copy of the approved visa (i.e. VEVO) issued by the Department of Home Affairs.

Broker guidance:

- Clear copies of identification documents held must contain matching personal information.
- If the individual has a different name from that on an identification document, you will also need to provide a change of name documentation or marriage certificate.
- Certificates must be issued by the Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages. Foreign birth certificates not in English must be accompanied by NAATI translation certificated.

- An officer with, or an authorised representative of, the holder of an Australian Financial Services Licence.
- An officer with, or a credit representative of, the holder of an Australian Credit Licence.
- Justice of the Peace.
- Employee of Australia Post.
- Chartered Accountant or Certified Practising Accountant (CPA).
- Police Officer.
- Teacher (full time employed as such).
- A person authorised as a notary public in a foreign country.
